Her current foster babies are the "Top Gun" crew shown with Annie. Maverick, Goose and Iceman! They will be available for adoption at the BVAS when they are old enough and after their neuters.

In 2020, Annie has fostered 30 cats and kittens and over the years thru TNR or fostering for the BVAS and other local cat rescues 130~ whether giving them space to birth babies in her home, to bottle feeding babies every 2 hours or nursing sick cats back to health! Her cat/kitten room setup is to be envied by many and Annie's heart is huge!



Bella Vista Dog License



BELLA VISTA
A place to call home

Dog licensing is not required.

The City of Bella Vista does not require dogs to be licensed by the city. However, by ordinance, dogs are required to bear a physical tag on a collar with the owner's name and address or a microchip referencing the owner's name and address.

If your dog is picked up by Animal Control, it will be taken to the Bella Vista Animal Shelter.

First Offense: Reclamation fee of \$25 shall be paid unless the dog is microchipped prior to reclamation. In such case, a fee of \$20 shall be paid.

Second Offense: Reclamation of \$25 shall be paid for a dog that has been microchipped prior to entering the shelter. A reclamation fee of \$50 shall be paid for a dog that has not been microchipped unless the dog is microchipped prior to reclamation. In such case, a fee of \$25 shall be paid.

Third and All Subsequent Offenses: Reclamation fee of \$75 shall be paid.

Why Should You Microchip Your Dog?

We use microchipping records to identify owners of dogs that are picked up by animal control, in order to return dogs home instead of taking them to the Bella Vista Animal Shelter. The information also enables us to know that the dog has been vaccinated for rabies. Provide your dog's information or submit questions to the city's Animal Control Officer via email to animalcontrol@bellavistaar.gov.

Fees cover spay/neuter, worm treatments; age appropriate shots including rabies inoculation (if old enough); dogs, DHLPP, cats FVRCP; and microchipping.

A Letter From Your Garage Sale Hostess

This is Anita—everybody knows me! For the last 13 years (except for 2016), it has been my sincere pleasure to welcome you all to my garage and driveway for the sale benefitting the Bella Vista Animal Shelter. What you might not realize is that it has always been a community-wide effort, from folks who donate great stuff, to the Shelter staff who collect and store it, to the volunteers who tag it and the people who help the days of the sale. It has grown every year to require tents and awnings. The weather hasn't always cooperated, but the response has always been super-positive. I bet each of you has at least one treasure you discovered and had to have—I know I do! The volunteers are packing up the last of it when I'm already asking them to help with the next year's sale. From what sometimes looks like utter chaos, we raise an integral part of the Shelter's ability to help every dog and cat, every puppy and kitten that comes our way.

Like your lives, the Shelter's operation has been turned upside down by the Covid-19 virus. By March, we should have been picking up donated items for the coming sale, storing them in the shed that was donated for that very purpose. This year, though, we complied with all social distance mandates. You were told not to have anyone enter your home; we were told not to send our staff out for pickups. As this quarantine dragged on, you cleaned out your closets but had to make other arrangements to make room for what you ordered on-line. We know we completely missed out on the donations that would have made our sale the win-win event it has become.

Our calendar has always included fund-raisers, large and small, which we absolutely depend on to support the cost of operating a 99.5% "Pawsitive Lives Matter" shelter. When our biggest and most popular event, The Wiener Dog Races, had to be canceled to avoid spreading the virus, that was the largest piece of a budget we won't meet this year. We've racked our brains to come up with some way to make money; there's nothing we can do and stay away from each other.

So, what I am asking all of you, especially you who have been our guests at the BVAS Garage sale and have gotten such great bargains over the years, let's have a virtual garage sale without all the stuff! There has never been a time when we've needed your donation dollars more. We wish as much as you do that our tables were brimming with incredible bargains of every description! If there had been any way possible, we'd have done it. What we're asking is if you'd have spent \$50 at our sale, could you donate \$50? Any and all donations will help. By late next spring/early summer, surely there will be a vaccine and we can once again crowd into my driveway and shop for bargains like every year since 2007.

Thank you all for your generosity and consideration. We promise a bang-up BVAS Garage Sale next year. I can't wait!
