### Apple Cheddar Dog Biscuits

Apple-cheddar dog biscuits have healthy ingredients and are a snap to make.

- 2 cups barley flour
- I/2 cup oatmeal
- 1/3 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/3 cup unsweetened applesauce
- 2 tablespoons olive oil

To make the treats, preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit and line a baking sheet with parchment paper. In a bowl mix all the ingredients plus about three table-spoons of water.

Form a dough and then roll it out like sugar cookie dough—about 1/4 inch thickness. Cut the biscuits out with favorite Christmas cookie cutters and place on the prepared baking sheets. Bake for 30 minutes. Cool on wire rack and store in an airtight container for up to two weeks.

#### Christmas Cat Treats

- I can tuna in oil, drained
- I egg
- I I/4 cups all-purpose flour
- I/2 cup water
- Dash of parsley (optional)

To make the Christmas cat treats, preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Place all ingredients in a food processor. Pulse until a dough forms. If the dough is sticky, add a bit more flour. If too dry, add a

tablespoon of water.

Roll the dough out to 1/4 inch thickness and cut with small cookie cutters.

Place on baking sheet, bake in oven for 20 minutes until browned. Cool and then store in an airtight container.

## **Cassidy the Non-Keto Canine**

Cassidy is as a sweet Dalmatian cross with spots on her ears. She came to us in terrible condition on a cold day in October 2020. Seeing that she was just skin and bones and shivering, our first priority was to get her body temperature back up. Once comfortable, Cassidy was placed on a slow gaining diet to ensure she would grow in a healthy manner. After the first week, it was clear something else was wrong.

We were feeling helpless, confused, and worried. It didn't matter how much she ate, she could not gain any weight.

Several vet visits later, we learned she has a condition called Exocrine Pancreatic Insufficiency (EPI) which is a syndrome caused by insufficient synthesis and secretion of digestive enzymes by the exocrine portion of the pancreas. She does not break down the food correctly. Without a strict medical plan, she would continue to wither away.

Cassidy's diet requires special food with low fat and high protein. She also requires an enzyme called Prozyme soaked into her kibble before every meal to be able to digest properly. Cassidy will most likely need this special diet her entire life.



After one year with the shelter, she looks wonderful! She is still at a slim weight but doesn't even resemble the dog we received in



October 2020. Cassidy is available for adoption to a home that has the time and energy to continue her medical plan.

She is a very loving dog that would be best suited as the only pet in the household. Until she finds her forever home, please consider sponsoring Cassidy and visiting her for some petting.


