


4TH QUARTER UPDATE 2022

This 3-year-old beautiful German Shepherd was brought to the shelter June, 2021. She had been on the run for a while and visiting our local churches. At one church they rigged the doorknob with a string so that when she entered the sanctuary they could close her in. Animal Control and Shelter staff moved her to the shelter.



Buffy came to us in 2020 as she was giving birth to kittens. She was a feral cat and would literally bounce off the walls when we tried to interact with her. Today she is still not a lap cat but much friendlier. This three year old girl had 4 kittens who have all been adopted.



Sir Kensington Wiggles III had been adopted back in August 2022. In October, however, his parent was placed on oxygen and could no longer care for him. This two year old pup is so happy and full of life, and his little butt wiggles like crazy. We all hope that we get him adopted out again soon.



These four 8 month old siblings came into us as abandoned newborns. They are extremely shy and hid from any prospective adopters. When volunteers ask for cat socialization time, these are the ones we send them to.



This beautiful 3 year old girl was adopted from BVAS for the first time in 2019. She is a lot of happy dog. Her exuberance for human interaction makes her tough to place with small children. She was returned once for digging in the yard. Adopted again and returned after two vears because her owners had to move. After two attempts at a home she is understandably confused to be back at the shelter.








This little girl came to us as a 9 month old feral barn cat. The owner alerted us when she was born and we advised that they should interact with the cat and bring her in as soon as she was weened. This did not occur. When the owner throught she might be pregnant they brought her in.



Kenzie was just a pup when she came to live at the shelter. In December she will have been with us 1 year. She is extremly happy, but does not play well with other dogs, children or cats. She needs some training to understand what is expected.



Oscar is an 8 year old Siamese cat. He has been at the shelter for over 5 years. This beautiful feral cat will live out his days with his fellow feral cats at the shelter. It is the goal of the BVAS to build a safe quiet space for our feral cat population called the "catuary."



Meet our longest dog resident Gunnar. You may have met him as he holds the first kennel at the shelter entrance. This is the best guard dog. He is a 7 year old, beautiful Catahula Leopard Dog that came to us at one year old. He loves the shelter staff and smaller dogs.
