


1ST QUARTER UPDATE 2023


By choosing a pet to sponsor you will be not only helping the shelter provide food and medical care for them, but also increasing the likelihood that this pet will be rescued.



Athena was momma to a litter of 8 pups. She came to us in October with her sister Aurora. Athena gave birth the following day. All Athena's cute pups have been adopted but Momma is still at the shelter. She is a 1-year-old Anatolian Shepherd mix.



Chuck Norris was found on shelter grounds. We don't know if he was deposited here or visited from the dump. He is an older feral cat who joined our existing feral population and is living his best indoor life.



Prescott came to us with two other kittens in 2017. They never fully became socialized. It is unfortunate for feral cats that arrive at the shelter. They can no longer live outdoors as they are used to being fed, but can not be integrated into a home as they are wild animals.



Fred is a big friendly guy. He helps us with school groups when they come to visit. He is a 2-year-old Labrador Retriever Shepherd mix. More like a bulldozer on leash but extremely friendly. His bark is very deep in pitch, making him the Barry White of our kennel.



Aurora came in with her sister Athena both were wearing collars but Aurora had came in with a very deep laceration to her right hind leg. They had been out in the elements for some time. She has made a full recovery but needs to get to know people before becoming the largest lap dog. She is a 1-year-old Anatolian Shepherd mix.



Larry, Curly and Mo were brought to the shelter as one litter in 2017. None of them took to socialization. When we receive kittens it is our policy to work with them to get them into loving homes. We have learned from the previous feral cat litters that this takes more than a few hours a day. We encourage our young volunteers to read to them to get them used to human voices.



After 439 days at the shelter, Big Red was adopted into a loving home, however, he was returned just before Valentines day because the family was evicted from their home. We hope this lovable, 3-year-old male shepherd mix, gets a new home soon.



Grayson was with us for only 46 days on his first visit to the Bella Vista Animal Shelter. He was featured on a McClarty Daniels social media ad and was quickly adopted. He was returned when the family developed a medical condition.



Jasper is a 3-year-old terrier that has been at the shelter several times. He is a champion escape artist who prefers to be with people all the time. He first came to the shelter in 2020 and has been adopted twice since then.


