Bella Vista Animal Shelter is a blessing! I reached out to them today to inquire if they would take back, care for, and find a new forever home for our much loved male tabby cat, Windsor, now known as Lucky, in the event of our passing.

The story of love at first sight began in September, 2021. My husband and I went to the Shelter to drop off cat and kitten food donations. Of course, we had to visit with the kitties there. The next thing I know, my husband is holding 9 month old Windsor like he's a newborn baby. We noticed one of Windsor's eyes was inflamed and we were told that the previous adopter had placed liquid oral antibiotics in his eye. The vet was evaluating him in a day or two and we were asked to check back with the Shelter in the near future.

We didn't hesitate and completed an adoption application the next day. During a follow-up phone call with the Shelter, we were told that Windsor's eye had to be removed and that he was recovering from the surgery.

We were blessed and 'lucky' to bring Windsor home in October. Our 10 year old cat, Webster, fell in love with him, they've bonded and are great buds. Windsor, aka Lucky, is now a special needs cat. With only I eye, he cannot go outdoors ever. Don't worry, he and Webster enjoy the screened 'catio' and screened garage as well as the run of the house.

We're meeting with our attorney tomorrow because we realized we hadn't included a Pet Directive for Lucky in our will. Let me tell you, a Pet Directive is a critical part of estate planning. The directive eases the mind of the Estate Executor and spells out precisely what you wish for your beloved pet(s).

Bella Vista Animal Shelter has graciously agreed to accommodate us. We will enter a bequest to them in our will revisions. The monetary donation is not required but as we all know, Bella Vista Animal Shelter is always there for all of us.



# TNR

TNR, which stands for Trap-Neuter-Return, is a humane approach to managing and reducing feral and stray cat populations. The process involves trapping the cats, having them neutered or spayed, and then returning them to their original location. TNR programs are widely recognized as effective for several reasons:

1. \*\*Population Control\*\*: Neutering and spaying prevent the cats from reproducing, which gradually reduces the population over time.

2. \*\*Behavioral Benefits\*\*: Neutered cats are less likely to exhibit behaviors like yowling, spraying, and fighting

Bella Vista Animal Shelter has been building our TNR program and we have seen a real difference. This year we took in 158 kittens, where we had over 200 consecutively for the previous 3 years. Roughly 100 community and feral cats have been trapped by Jason Winter after his shift ends at the shelter. He then delivers the felines to the NWA Community Cat Project in Prairie Grove, where volunteer vets get all the felines spayed or neutered.

#### **RULES FOR TNR**

- Call and make an appointment
- Do not feed cats on trap day
- Do not move traps

• Tell your neighbors that BVAS is trapping cats, all other cats should remain indoors.

•The cats will need to be kept in a garage or safe space overnight

•Cats will not be removed from the neighborhood unless they are friendly and can be adopted.

#### Funding TNR program

Each year on the 5th of May we partner with a local business to raise money and awareness for our TNR program. Kids play games, we sell cat toys and furniture and celebrate cats. Bella Vista Rotary has also provided a grant to purchase traps



The cost for each cat is roughly \$50. The loose change that you put in the money jars around town, dedicated contributions and proceeds from Cinco de Meow have raised over \$3,000 toward this program. These moneys pay for veterinary costs, gas to Prairie Grove and traps when the occasional raccoon or opossum destroys them. Thank you for to everyone who helps with this effort. The Bella Vista Blue Bird Society and the Bella Vista Animal Shelter want to encourage anyone who is feeding outside cats to register for the TNR program to keep our feral cat population down and our songbird population up.



## ARE YOU KITTEN ME? FERAL & COMMUNITY CATS ARE NOT THE SAME

The terms "feral cats" and "community cats" both refer to cats that live outdoors and are typically not owned by anyone, but they differ slightly in their connotations and the contexts in which they're used:

### Feral Cats

Feral cats are typically wild, unsocialized cats that have had little to no human contact. They are often the offspring of other feral cats and have grown up without human interaction, making them more likely to be wary or fearful of people. Feral cats are usually elusive, avoid human contact, and may only come out at night. They often live in colonies, which can be found in urban, suburban, or rural areas. It is challenging to socialize feral cats, especially adults, and they usually cannot be adopted into homes. TNR programs are often the most effective way to manage their populations.

#### Community Cats

The term "community cats" is often used more broadly to describe any cat that lives outdoors and is not owned by a single person. This can include feral cats as well as stray cats that have been abandoned or have wandered away from home but may still be socialized to some degree. accustomed to human presence and may even be friendly, especially if they have been fed by people or have had previous owners. Some community cats, particularly strays, may be adoptable and can adjust to living in homes. However, many still thrive in their outdoor environments and are managed through TNR programs.

## Key Differences

• Feral cats are typically unsocialized and avoid humans, while community cats may include a mix of socialized and unsocialized cats.

• Feral cats are usually not adoptable, while some community cats, particularly those with past human interaction, may be.

Both terms are used in the context of managing outdoor cat populations, with "community cats" being a more inclusive and often more positive term that emphasizes the role of these cats within the local ecosystem and community.




